

Monthly Report – August 15, 2017, Town of Oswego Highway Department

- Rathburn Road bridge. We are still exploring alternate options in order to further reduce costs. I reached out to the County Engineer, asking to meet with us to discuss other designs. Plan to find and expose the water main east of the bridge with OCWA to confirm location in early October.
- NYSDOT, State Route 104 project. Most work progressing well. If weather stays nice, things will continue to flow smoothly. I had a comment the West Lake Road intersection is much better now that blacktop has been laid.
- Clean ditches, replacing culverts, repairing shoulders, mowing, (later than usual due to wet weather). Have received many calls concerning wetter than normal lawns. Although many ditches throughout the Town may need cleaning, the problem is due to the higher than normal rainfall – and/or runoff from neighboring properties.
- Paving concluded on Regan and Furniss. Maple Ave may be done in October w/ Rifenberg with extra money in CHIPS Account.
- Discussed gravel pit w/ NYMIR Rep. Unused Liability. Propose sale of property.
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- BUILDINGS AND GROUNDS
- We are still in contact with National Grid over the feeders for the Fred Haynes Blvd street lights. Plans are complete, a work order has been issued. The north end, at Co Rt 89, temporary OH feed will be discontinued in the future and a new, underground feed will be installed. A new, LED fixture was installed in time for Harborfest.
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- SEWER SYSTEMS
- Ontario Heights – working with engineer to ensure new pump station is equipped with all necessary equipment etc. Planning to smoke test in early October.
